What's happening in literacy?

This term in literacy students have been learning about Australia and it's states and territories. Each week we have been focusing on one state to gain a deeper understanding of its location, population, important natural features, significant Aboriginal sacred sites and tourist attractions.

It has been wonderful to see students build on their information and write an information report about each state. Students have combined information to form paragraphs, with a focus on including a topic sentence, supporting details and a concluding sentence in each paragraph.

In reading we have also been summarising texts, learning how to skim and scan when reading, and answering comprehension questions about texts.

What's happening in maths?

In numeracy sessions this term we are focusing on money. Students have been learning how to add coins to find the total, as well as work out simple money transactions and change.

We have also spent some time looking at shapes including naming the features of 2D and 3D shapes. For the remainder of the term we will be looking at, statistics and probability, location and direction, data as well as capacity, temperature and mass.

Students continue to keep building their multiplication facts and speed.

What's happening in RRRR?

This term in Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR) we have been looking at:

Topic 7: Gender and Identity— Students explored their own identify and how there are many different layers to their identify, and how it can change depending on the context ie being at home vs at school. Students will develop an understanding of gender norms and the influence of the media and literature in the construction of gender norms.

We will also be moving on to **Topic 8: Positive Gender Relations**—where students will describe and demonstrate what respectful, gender inclusive behaviours look like.

What's happening in science?

Feather, Fur or leaves?

Students are working to detect similarities between objects and living things, and learning how science organises them into a system. They are discussing questions for investigation and responding to as least one question through a Science inquiry
