

MOBILE PHONE – STUDENT USE POLICY

PURPOSE

To explain to our school community the Department's and Kangaroo Flat Primary School's policy requirements and expectations relating to students using mobile phones [and other personal mobile devices] during school hours.

SCOPE

This policy applies to:

1. All students at Kangaroo Flat Primary School and,
2. Students' personal mobile phones and other personal mobile devices (such as wearable technology /smart watches] brought onto school premises during school hours, including recess and lunchtime.

DEFINITIONS

A mobile phone is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. For the purpose of this policy, "mobile phone" refers to mobile phones and any device that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone such as smart watches.

POLICY

Kangaroo Flat Primary School understands that students may bring a personal mobile phone to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school.

At KFPS:

- Students who choose to bring mobile phones to school must have them switched off and securely stored during school hours
- Exceptions to this policy may be applied if certain conditions are met (see below for further information)
- When emergencies occur, parents or carers should reach their child by calling the school on ph:5447 5100

Personal mobile phone use

In accordance with the Department's [Mobile Phones – Student Use Policy](#) issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones must not be used at Kangaroo Flat Primary School during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted. Students who wear smart watches or wearable technology the telecommunication capability must switched off so access to phone /messaging etc is disabled during school hours (8:45am – 3:00pm)

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

Secure storage

Mobile phones owned by students at Kangaroo Flat Primary School are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Please note that Kangaroo Flat Primary School does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft. Students and their parents/carers are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items.

Where students bring a mobile phone to school, our school will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. At KFPS, students are required to store their phones in the classroom safe that has been purchased to securely store mobile phone technology.

Enforcement

Students who use their personal mobile phones inappropriately at Kangaroo Flat Primary School and/or refuse to hand over the item(s) when instructed by staff to do so may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's existing student engagement policy.

At Kangaroo Flat Primary School inappropriate use of mobile phones is **any use during school hours**, unless an exception has been granted, and particularly use of a mobile phone:

- in any way that disrupts the learning of others
- to send inappropriate, harassing or threatening messages or phone calls
- to engage in inappropriate social media use including cyber bullying
- to capture video or images of people, including students, teachers and members of the school community without their permission
- to capture video or images in the school toilets, changing rooms, swimming pools and gyms
- during tests and assessments

Exceptions

Exceptions to the policy:

- may be applied during school hours if certain conditions are met, specifically,
 - Health and wellbeing-related exceptions; and
 - Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite.
- can be granted by the Principal, or by the teacher for that class, in accordance with the Department's [Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy](#).

The categories of exceptions allowed under the Department's [Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy](#) are:

1. Health and wellbeing-related exceptions

Specific exception	Documentation
Students with a health condition e.g a student with diabetes who may use a mobile phone to monitor their blood sugar.	Student Health Support Plan

2. Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite

Specific exception	Documentation
Students on excursions and camps	Risk assessment planning documentation

Where an exception is granted, the student can only use the mobile phone for the purpose for which it was granted.

Camps, excursions and extracurricular activities

Kangaroo Flat Primary School will provide students and their parents and carers with information about items that **can or cannot** be brought to camps, excursions, special activities and events, including personal mobile phones.

Exclusions

This policy does not apply to

- Out-of-School-Hours Care (OSHC)
- Out-of-school-hours events
- Travelling to and from school

COMMUNICATION

This policy will be communicated to our school community in the following ways:

- Included in staff induction processes and staff training
- Included in school newsletter
- Included in staff handbook/manual
- Discussed at annual staff briefings/meetings
- Included in transition and enrolment packs
- Hard copy available from school administration upon request
